

**Am I Eligible?**

Qualified candidates consist of students who:

- Are a United States Citizen
- Are currently enrolled in an undergraduate or graduate accredited college degree program with rising junior, senior, or graduate standing
- Have a declared major, minor or concentration in one or more of the following: International Relations, Political Science, or Area Studies: Arabic or Middle East
- Have some knowledge of Arabic (rating score of 1+ or higher in Arabic speaking proficiency as measured according to the Interagency Language Roundtable skill level description)
- Have a minimum 3.0 GPA

**How Do I Apply?**

Applicants MUST complete and submit the following, no later than 5:00 PM EST on December 7, 2007, via the NSI Web site:

- Three (3) Recommendations (2 from faculty)
- Essay/Personal Statement
- Certified College Transcripts From ALL Institutions Attended

Application processing timeline:

- Applicants who meet preliminary qualification will be notified by December 14, 2007
- Language testing and security processing and screening will begin January 7, 2008 (more information on clearance and screening process available on the NSI Web site)

- All applicants will be notified of acceptance, alternate status, or rejection by May 2, 2008


